- 1. James Likely the earliest, written by the brother of Jesus to Jewish Christians, reflecting early Christian ethics and
- 2. Galatians Written to counter Judaizers and defend justification by faith, likely before the Jerusalem Council (Acts 1
- 3. 1 Thessalonians Earliest of Paul's letters, addressing the Second Coming and persecution of believers.
- 4. 2 Thessalonians Follow-up letter addressing misunderstandings about the Second Coming.
- 5. 1 Corinthians Written to address issues of division, immorality, and spiritual gifts in the Corinthian church.
- 6. 2 Corinthians Paul's defense of his apostleship and a call to reconciliation.
- 7. Romans Paul's most comprehensive theological letter, likely written from Corinth on his way to Jerusalem.
- 8. Ephesians Prison letter emphasizing unity in the body of Christ, likely written during Roman imprisonment.
- 9. Philippians Prison letter expressing joy and encouragement, reflecting Paul's mature faith.
- 10. Colossians Prison letter addressing the supremacy of Christ and warning against false teachings.
- 11. Philemon Personal prison letter appealing for mercy on behalf of a runaway slave, Onesimus.
- 12. 1 Timothy Pastoral letter offering guidance to young leader Timothy.
- 13. Titus Pastoral letter providing instructions on church leadership and sound doctrine.
- 14. 2 Timothy Paul's final letter, written from prison, offering a final charge to Timothy.
- Mark Considered the earliest Gospel, providing a straightforward account of Jesus's ministry.
- 16. Matthew Written to a Jewish audience, emphasizing Jesus as the promised Messiah.
- 17. Luke A detailed account written by a Gentile physician, focusing on Jesus's compassion and inclusivity.
- 18. Acts Luke's sequel to his Gospel, documenting the early church and missionary work of the apostles.
- 19. John A later theological Gospel, emphasizing Jesus's divine nature and deeper spiritual truths.
- 20. 1 John Encouragement to remain in the truth and walk in love, possibly written alongside the Gospel of John.
- 21. 2 John A brief letter warning against false teachers and encouraging faithfulness.
- 22. 3 John A personal letter commending hospitality and warning against church troublemakers.
- 23. 1 Peter Written to Christians facing persecution, offering encouragement and instruction.
- 24. 2 Peter A final letter warning against false teachers and reminding of Christ's return.
- 25. Hebrews An anonymous sermon-like letter emphasizing Christ's superiority and new covenant.
- 26. Jude A short letter warning against false teachings and apostasy.
- 27. Revelation The final book, a prophetic vision given to John while exiled on Patmos.
